A NOTE FROM OUR **Executive Director**



Last year was an extraordinary year for the Kids' Fund as we navigated many obstacles to continue supporting children with special needs across British Columbia. Despite the ongoing pandemic, multiple natural disasters and an increasingly volatile economy, we increased our individual grants by twenty-five percent over the year before. I am very grateful for the generosity of our donors who opened their wallets and their hearts to help meet the need of the families and children hardest hit by these challenges.

The Kids' Fund is one of the largest individual funders for children with special needs in the province, which combined with our inclusive criteria for funding, make us a lifeline for many families. In 2021, we saw a rise in requests for counselling to help children with disabilities cope with sudden routine changes, as well as requests for speech, occupational, and other therapy programs to help kids continue to build essential life skills. The biggest increase were in grants for tutoring and education, with requests more than doubling from pre-pandemic numbers. With school closures, changes to curriculum, and at-home learning for larger portions of the school year many families required additional supports to provide what schools normally provided.

We could not have met this demand without the support of our donors, partners and sponsors. Because of you, families in BC can count on the CKNW Kids' Fund to help ensure their child has a brighter future. Thank you, we are so grateful.



Campership Programs for specialized summer camps, giving kids the chance to build lasting friendships and memories in an environment catered to them




